



Customer Satisfaction Survey Results

Thanks to everyone who took the time to fill out our Customer Satisfaction Survey. We appreciate all your feedback. We had 2,300 customers complete the survey with an overall approval rate of 99%! The survey asked for our customers to rate our service on a scale of 1-5 with one being the lowest (96% responded in all categories with a 4 or 5, and 3% with 3's).



We received many good suggestions and questions. Below you will find answers to those questions that were the most popular. Please remember that the whole NRWS team is here to help you; give us a call and we will be happy to help answer any questions.

Popular Questions and Answers

Q: Yard waste: why can't we have pick ups each week like other communities? Can we have additional yard waste carts part of the year?

A: Communities that have yard waste pick up once a week only provide their customers with one yard waste cart. NRWS provides two yard waste carts and picks them up every other week. Thus you have the same amount of service as other communities but with less wear and tear on the roads, less emissions being produced, and less labor associated with pickups that protect our environment and keep costs down. If the Town wished to change to a weekly yard waste pickup NRWS would have to establish more routes, buy more trucks for collection, and thus increase costs to all customers. The same thing is true if NRWS was to drop off extra yard waste carts during the fall and spring and then pick them back up; there would be a large labor cost associated with providing the entire community with extra carts. The Town of Paradise and NRWS's goal is to support the future of our community through innovative collection approaches that increase sustainability and keep costs down. These approaches have made Paradise a leader of sustainability in Butte County.

Q: I don't fill up my trash can weekly, can I have every other week pickup?

A: No. It is State law for garbage to be picked up every seven days and is enforced by local ordinance that all residents within the Town of Paradise have weekly trash service.

Q: When will I be able to recycle Styrofoam?

A: NRWS used to take Bulk Styrofoam at our Recycling Center, unfortunately, the company Timbron that was taking our material has gone out of business. There are no local manufacturers that will take Styrofoam for recycling at this time. When markets open to accept Styrofoam and we are assured that it is being recycled in an environmentally responsible manner, we will start collecting it. You can call our local packaging stores (UPS, PostNet ect.), to see if they will take your bulk Styrofoam and peanuts for reuse. The best option is to reduce your Styrofoam waste by avoiding purchasing it when you can.

Q: Is there a way to get my neighbors to bring their cans in after service? *A:* Yes, you can call Code Enforcement and report the problem and they will address it. It is required that you bring your cans off the street at least 24 hours after service. Congratulations to **Paul Holman** our winner of a FREE Year of Service.

Bottles & jars, all colors, lids OK, rinsed and emptied.

Aluminum cans, tin & steel cans, clean aluminum pans & foil, empty aerosol cans, small scrap metal (36" or less), pots, pans & utensils, loose lids from jars.

All CRV containers accepted, bottles, jugs, all colors / caps kept on, all rigid non-bottle plastic, such as: tubs and containers, toys, clamshell trays & deli containers, plant pots and laundry baskets.
