Don't Rush to Flush: What to do with Rx's

What should you do with expired and unused prescription and over-the-counter medications (also known as pharmaceuticals)?

- Each year \$225 billion in medications are prescribed.
- Nearly 40% of prescribed medications aren't taken and end up being improperly discarded or flushed.
- Studies have found that up to 80% of streams in the U.S. have measurable concentrations of prescription drugs.

Wastewater treatment plants cannot remove pharmaceuticals from the water, so flushing them down the toilet or pouring them down the drain will only end up polluting the environment and exposing humans, plants and animals to harmful chemicals and hormones. Throwing pharmaceuticals in the trash can still contaminate the environment, and runs the risk of someone else finding them and abusing them.

Giving away old clothes and other unwanted items to non-profits and thrift stores keeps good items out of the trash and can save you money. Online websites like Freecycle and Craigslist make reusing items easy and convenient.

The Town of Paradise Household Hazardous Waste Facility has a reuse program too. Often residents turn in items at the household hazardous waste facility that are still usable. These reusable items are available for FREE! Stop by the by Household Hazardous Waste Facility on Reuse Center Days (See Calendar) to get free reusable household products like paints, cleaners, garden supplies and more!

Guidelines for Residential Curbside Service

- 1. Place all carts at the curb the night before your service day before 5:30 a.m. the day of service. If this is not possible, or you have additional questions please call (530) 876-3340 and we will assist you.
- 2. Place carts at least two feet apart with wheels facing away from the street at the curb to help prevent carts from being tipped over as they are serviced using our automated collection system.
- **3.** Cart lids must close completely. Environmental regulations dictate that cart lids must be closed at all times to prevent spillage. Carts that are consistently overloaded and not closed may indicate that you need to upgrade to the next larger cart size, or increase recycling services. Please call our customer service department for available options at (530) 876-3340.
- 4. If you have more material than can fit in your cart, please contact us, at least 24 hours prior to your service day at (530)876-3340 and we will pick up the "extras" left around the cart for a nominal fee.
- 5. If you are going on vacation and wish to put a temporary stop on your service, please notify us at (530) 876-3340 with your stop service date and return date. If you are away for a minimum of four weeks or more, your account will be credited for the interruption of service. However, Northern Recycling & Waste Services must be notified in advance.
- 6. If you have a large household item, such as a dryer or T.V., or extra debris, that requires a special pick-up, please contact us at least 24 hours prior to the day you would like these items collected at (530) 876-3340. Fees apply.
