# **Preventing Hot Load Fires**

Proper fire safety is a necessity on the Ridge, however many people don't consider the importance of fire safety associated with recycling and garbage collection. Fires occur when combustible or hot material is placed in a recycling/ garbage can, which can catch fire posing a serious threat to homes and collection trucks. Please make sure everyone in your family is educated regarding combustible items that should not be placed in the recycling or garbage cart. Taking proper action saves property and lives. Below is a list of items that either by themselves or in combination with each other, are the most common causes of hot load fires.

### Items That Should NEVER be Placed in Your Curb Side Carts

- Hot Ashes from fireplaces or barbecues: *if you want to put your ashes in your yardwaste cart make sure they have been sitting outside for at least 3 weeks.*
- Paints or Paint Thinners: free disposal at HHW facility for residential customers only.
- Oils: free disposal of at NRWS Recycling, O'Reilly's, Lyon's Express Lube, Jiffy Lube, or Auto Zone.
- Fuels: free disposal at HHW facility for residential customer only.
- Brake Fluid: free disposal at NRWS Recycling Center.
- Pool or Spa Chemicals: *free disposal at HHW facility, for residential customers only.*
- All Batteries: free disposal at NRWS Recycling Center. Please note that batteries larger than D must be taped prior to drop off.
