Christmas Trees can be dropped off, free of charge **during the month of January 2015** at the Town of Paradise Vegetative Waste Facility located at 925 American Way, Paradise. Trees with tinsel or flocking will not be accepted.

You may also place your tree inside of your brown cart in 3 ft. sections so it fits with lid closed; **NOT outside it**. Pick up is **on your regular service day**. All ornaments and metal stands must be removed.

**Flocked trees will not be accepted.**

Ever wonder where all your yard waste goes once it is picked up from your house? It goes directly to the Earthworm Soil Factory on Neal Road. The green waste is ground, composted, and then used as feedstock for earthworms. The worms feed on the nutrient-rich green waste compost, producing vermicompost or worm castings, a natural beneficial soil amendment. You can buy the finish product from Earthworm Soil Factory Tuesday - Friday 8:30 a.m to 4:30 p.m. and Saturday 8:30 a.m. to noon.
