## **Guide to Living in Bear Country**

- Bears are attracted to anything that is edible or smelly.
- Garbage problems can be solved by securing the lids of the NRWS carts with a strap or cord, drivers will remove. In addition, store carts inside a shed or garage between service days.
- Freeze food scraps and place in garabage when taking cart to the street for service day.
- Don't leave trash, groceries or animal feed in your car.
- Keep garbage cans clean and deodorize them with bleach or ammonia.
- Harvest fruit off trees as soon as it's ripe, & promptly collect fallen fruit
- Avoid using bird feeders, they are a powerful attractant.
- Don't leave any scented products outside, even non-food items such as suntan lotion, insect repellent, soap or candles.
- Keep barbecue grills clean.
- Keep pet food and pets inside.
- Securely block access to potential crawl spaces under decks and buildings.
- Keep doors and windows closed and locked. Scents can lure bears inside.
- Consider installing motion-detector alarms, electric fencing or motionactivated sprinklers.
- Remove all food from homes and cabins that will be unoccupied for an extended period of time.



People have a responsibility to the wildlife whose habitat they are sharing. Never feed a Bear! Once conditioned to human sources of food bears will seek them out, creating confilcts with humans.

#### Lithium Batteries

Lithium batteries, when damaged can cause fires (i.e. when compacted in a garbage truck or crushed with a 80,000 lb. landfill compactor). Batteries overheat when the insulation is damaged and a short occurs. Lithium-metal battery fires can exceed 900 degrees F. and react violently when exposed to water which in a garbage truck /landfill is readily present.

Proper recycling of lithium batteries is key to preventing fires. First, make sure these batteries are removed from the fixture, tool, toy, or device. Lithium batteries are typically labeled. Place tape over the battery contacts. Then, take all batteries to your local household hazardous waste recycling center. Batteries will be recycled or disposed of safely.
