Closing the Loop

Do you know why the recycling symbol has three chasing arrows? Each arrow represents one step in the three step recycling process that completes the recycling loop.

The first step is collection. This is when you put your recyclables into your blue recycling cart or take them to a drop-off site. The collected materials are then prepared for market and sold to a manufacturing facility.

Manufacturing is the second step in the recycling process. The recyclable materials are converted into new products and shipped to stores to be sold as new consumer goods.

The third step is where you, the consumer, purchase products made with recycled content. When you “Buy Recycled”, you complete the recycling loop. Always check the post consumer recycled content (%) of the products you buy. A higher % means more of the product was made from recyclables collected from residential or commercial recycling programs.

Are you buying Recycled?

Recycling helps preserve our environment, supports our economy and can save you money. The best way to really make recycling work is to use recycled products and packaging. It's up to you to close the recycling loop. Use your Purchase Power and buy household products and packages made from recycled materials.

Every 20 cases of recycled paper saves 17 trees, 390 gallons of oil, 7000 gallons of water, and 4100 kwh of energy. It also eliminates 60 pounds of air-polluting emissions and saves 8 cubic feet of landfill space.

Items You Can Buy

Made of Recycled Material



Recycling symbol with circle = Products made from recycled material

Glass: Glass bottles & jars
Glass bowls, vases, & candle holders.
Found in all brands, all stores.

Steel (tin) cans: All steel products.
Found in all brands, all stores.

PET Plastic: Carpet, fleece jackets, hats & gloves. Look for “made of recycled content material label.”

Aluminum cans: All cans, found at all stores in all brands.

HDPE Plastic: Trash bags and plastic lumber. Found at various stores, some brands for plastic lumber include, TREX and Bend-a-Board.

Mixed Paper: Paper towels, napkins, tissue paper. Look for the “made from recycled content material label.”
