Is Your Business **SB 1383** Compliant?

California's SB 1383 Law requires businesses in the Town of Paradise to have recycling and organic waste (compost) collection service.

Make sure your business is meeting the law and helping our community reduce waste and protect the environment.

Businesses must have:



Trash Collection

Reliable collection for all landfill waste.



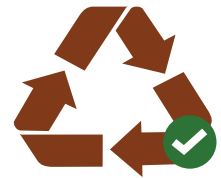
Recycling Collection

Recycle clean materials.



Organic Waste (Compost) Collection

Collect organic waste (food & yard waste).



Proper Separation of Materials

Keep materials separate to stay compliant.



IMPORTANT:

SB 1383 organics (compost) requirements currently apply only to businesses located in the Town of Paradise.

These organics (compost) requirements do not currently apply to businesses in unincorporated Butte County.

Recycling Contamination Program Reminder

Help keep recycling clean. Placing trash, food waste, plastic bags, or other non-recyclable materials into recycling containers contaminates entire loads and makes valuable recyclable materials unusable.

Northern Recycling continues to monitor commercial recycling containers as required by the State to help reduce contamination and improve recycling efforts.

Service Monitoring

- State-required monitoring is conducted using driver observations and onboard cameras.
- If contamination is found, it will be photographed and attached to the account.
- A notification letter with educational information will be provided when contamination is identified.

When Contaminations Occur

1st & 2nd

Contamination incidents will result in notification letters.

3rd & 4th

Contamination incidents will result in a notification letter and a fine.

5th

On the fifth occurrence, the customer will receive a letter informing them they have lost their option to participate in the cost-free program and the recycling container is removed. The customer can then call to opt into a paid program to keep their containers.

Recycling Do's & Don'ts

1. RECYCLE ALL BOTTLES, CANS, AND PAPER

2. KEEP ITEMS CLEAN AND DRY

3. NO PLASTIC BAGS



Plastic Bottles & Containers

Rinsed plastic bottles, jars, jugs and tubs.



Food & Beverage cans

Clean tin, aluminum, steel food and beverage cans.



Glass

Rinsed glass bottles and jars.



Paper

Paper, newspaper, paperboard and magazines.



Flattened Cardboard & Paperboard

Breakdown and flatten all boxes.

*** REMEMBER PLASTIC BAGS ARE NOT RECYCLABLE *** DO NOT BAG YOUR RECYCLING ***

KEEP THESE ITEMS OUT OF YOUR RECYCLING CART.

You have heard the saying, "one bad apple can spoil the bunch." The same goes for recycling. We need your help to keep these items out of the recycling cart.



NO Food, Food-soiled Paper, Waxed Cardboard



NO Plastic Bags, Tarps, or Film



NO Cords/Wires, Rope, or Hoses



NO Food Wrappers or Broken Dishes



NO Electronics or Batteries



NO Yard Waste or Grass Clippings



NO Foam Cups, Packaging, or Containers



NO Diapers or Pet waste



NO Clothing, Shoes or Fabric



NO Hazardous or Medical Waste
